(When there is this sign* behind the verb, you can or must use an auxiliary verb like „can, must, could or should“ .

If Jim (not invite) me to his party, I (be) very disappointed.	<i>If Jim doesn't invite me to his party, I will be very disappointed.</i>
<i>If it's warm enough at the weekend, we will (can, could) go on a bike tour.</i>	If it (be) warm enough at the weekend, we (go*) on a bike tour.
If you (be) interested in history, you (go*) to the Castle Museum.	<i>If you are interested in history, you should (can, could) go to the Castle Museum.</i>
<i>If you eat too much junk food, you will get fat.</i>	If you (eat) too much junk food, you (get) fat.
If the train (be) late, I (call) you.	<i>If the train is late, I will call you.</i>
<i>If you don't answer my letter soon, I will not (won't) write again.</i>	If you (not answer) my letter soon, I (not write) again.
If you (not stop) talking, you (get) extra homework.	<i>If you don't stop talking, you will get extra homework.</i>
<i>I will have a party if I pass this exam.</i>	I (have) a party if I (pass) this exam.
You (phone*) me if you (miss) your bus.	<i>You should (must) phone me if you miss your bus.</i>
<i>You should (can, must) tell me if you need help.</i>	You (tell *) me if you need help.

You (save) a lot of time if you (have) a car.	<i>You would (could) save a lot of time if you had a car.</i>
<i>We would (could) catch the bus if we ran a bit faster.</i>	We (catch) the bus if we (run) a bit faster.
I (not climb) that tree if I (be) you.	<i>I wouldn't climb that tree if I were (was) you.</i>
<i>John wouldn't dump his girlfriend if she had more time for him.</i>	John (not dump) his girlfriend if she (have) more time for him.
If Sarah (not like) maths, she (not study) it at university.	<i>If Sarah didn't like maths, she wouldn't study it at university.</i>
<i>If my mum weren't (wasn't) so strict, I wouldn't lie to her.</i>	If my mum (not be) so strict, I (not lie) to her.
If I (find) a wallet with a lot of money in the street, I (not keep) it.	<i>If I found a wallet with a lot of money in the street, I wouldn't keep it.</i>
<i>If I met Robert Pattinson in the street I would be too excited to talk to him.</i>	If I (meet) Robert Pattinson in the street I (be) too excited to talk to him.
If I (have) ten pounds more, I (buy) these jeans.	<i>If I had ten pounds more, I would (could) buy these jeans.</i>
<i>It would be much easier to lose weight if I didn't like sweets so much.</i>	It (be) much easier to lose weight if I (not like) sweets so much.
